

## What is FLEX time?

#### FLEX-PECTATIONS

STUDENTS MUST ARRIVE TO THEIR FLEX CLASS BY THE **START OF THE BELL** AND **REMAIN** IN THE CLASS FOR THE FULL PERIOD.

FLEX TIME IS CLASS TIME/INSTRUCTIONAL TIME

– STUDENTS MUST BE IN A CLASSROOM OR

LEARNING SPACE DURING FLEX TIME.

STUDENTS MUST BE IN CLASSES WITH THEIR **OWN** TEACHERS.

#### University Admission Requirements

There are always TWO types of admission requirements

1) General University Admission Requirements

UBC, UVIC, SFU – Minimum average required will fluctuate year to year

- English Studies 12
- 4 academic Gr. 12 subjects (Geography, History, Physics, French,
   Chemistry, Biology, Law, Math, Calculus, Social Justice, Mandarin)
- \*\*Not Psychology 12
- A language at the Grade 11 level (Challenge Exams)

#### 2) Specific Program Admission Requirements

**Example: UBC, SFU and UVIC Faculty of Science** (minimum average will fluctuate year to year)

- Physics 11 and Chemistry 11
- 2 Gr. 12 Sciences (Chemistry, Physics, Biology)
- Pre-Calculus Math 12
- Total of 5 Grade 12 Academics (minimum)
- Language 11 (with UVic as an exception)



- American universities have an earlier application deadline Common Applications website
- Students encouraged to do the research for US schools find out when application deadlines are
- Attend Common App application workshop on October 15 at lunch
- Let counsellors/IB coordinator know if you need help with the application process
- PSAT: Sign up in counselling.
- PSAT Exam: October 16 3:00pm-8:00pm

# University Application Process

#### **Deadlines**

- UBC January 15, 2020 (December 1, 2019 for scholarship consideration)
- SFU January 15, 2020 (December 15, 2019 for scholarship consideration)
- UVic, TWU end of February 2020
- Trade Schools limited spaces
- Kwantlen and UFV Ongoing until spaces are filled (June 1st)
- Please confirm with your chosen post-secondary institution

#### When can students apply?

- UBC now
- UFV, KPU, SFU, UVic, TRU, CapU October 1st
- BCIT, most other Universities November 1st

## Self-Reporting Grades

- Post Secondary Institutions send confirmation of application by email
- Applicant is given a student number for that school
- Use this for all communication
- IB diploma students use their Predicted Grades only for some Universities

#### **Self-Reporting Grades**

- Most Post Secondary Schools use this method
- Respect Due Dates usually March
- What happens to courses that are in progress?



 Scholarships – Monetary awards for academic excellence. Other criteria such as leadership, community involvement and athletics considered

 Awards – Monetary awards made in recognition of achievement and significant individual contributions

• **Bursaries** – Grants made to students who demonstrate need. A financial statement must be included.

• Loans – Money borrowed by a student demonstrating financial need and must be repaid. Studentaidbc is a great resource.

All usually require a transcript and letter(s) of reference



- 1. **Provincial Scholarship** –BC Excellence Scholarship, BC Achievement Scholarship, Teacher Education Scholarship, Train-in-Trades Scholarship
- 2. Post-Secondary School Entrance Scholarships and Awards— Administered by Post-Secondary Institutions
- 3. Scholarships Sponsored by Private Organizations Information and application deadlines are ongoing
- 4. **District Authority Scholarship** Indigenous Languages and Culture, Fine Arts, Applied Design skills and Technologies, Trades, Physical Activity, International Languages, Community Services
- 5. Locally Sponsored Scholarships, Awards and Bursaries applied for in February of your Grade 12 year (one application)
