# **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### How many volunteer hours do I need to graduate?

No volunteer log or form is required to graduate. Instead, this is one potential component included within the Career Life Connections 12 (CLC 12) Course OR the Creativity Action Service (CAS) course. Each course has a different outline as to what is required for graduation.
