



University Admission Requirements

There are TWO types of admission requirements

1. General post-secondary admission requirements



- English Studies 12
- 5 additional **academic** Grade 12 subjects (please check individual university websites)
 - Not Psychology 12, only IB Psychology counts as academic
- A language at the Grade 11 level (Challenge Exams)

Ex. Kwantlen and UFV

- English Studies 12
- 2 Grade 12 academics (min. B)



2) Specific Program Admission Requirements

Example: UBC and SFU Faculty of Science

(min. admission average will fluctuate year to year)

- English Studies 12
- Physics 11 and Chemistry 11
- 2 Grade 12 Sciences (Chemistry, Physics, Biology)
- Pre-Calculus Math 12
- Total of 6 Grade 12 Academics (minimum)
- Language 11

OUAC—application portal that is used to apply to Ontario universities

Applying to US Universities

- Common Applications website
- American universities have an earlier application deadline
 - Students encouraged to do the research for US schools find out when application deadlines are
- Let counsellors know if you need help with the application process

- Nine-digit number
- Assigned by BC Ministry of Education
- Located on report cards (top right-hand side)

University Application Process

Deadlines

- UBC January 15, 2024 (December 1, 2023 for scholarship consideration)
- SFU January 31, 2024 (December 15, 2023 for scholarship consideration)
- UVic January 31, 2024
- TWU February 15, 2024
- Trade Schools limited spaces; first qualified first accepted.
- KPU, UFV Ongoing until spaces are filled (June 1st) except specialty programs.

Please confirm with the post-secondary institution of your choice

When can students apply?

- UVic, TWU, Emily Carr open now
- UFV, KPU Oct 1
- BCIT Oct 3
- UBC, SFU Early October

Self-Reporting Grades

- Post-secondary institutions send confirmation of application by email
- Applicant is given a student number for that school
- Use this for all communication with that institutions
- IB Diploma students use their Predicted Grades only for some Universities

Self-Reporting Grades

- Most post-secondary schools use this method
- Due dates are firm
- What happens to courses that are in progress?
 - Online courses need to be completed by June


- 1. **Scholarship Handbook**—This is a great resource that highlights the types of scholarships available and how to apply for them. Please ensure that you read through this.
