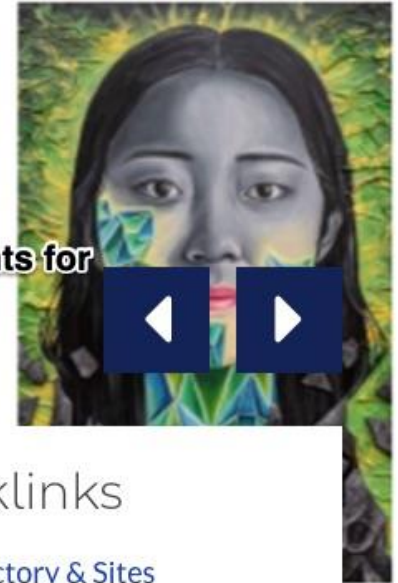

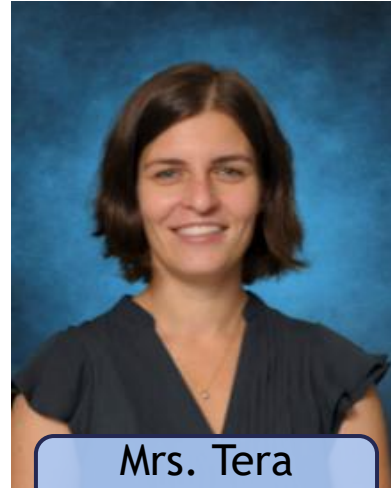

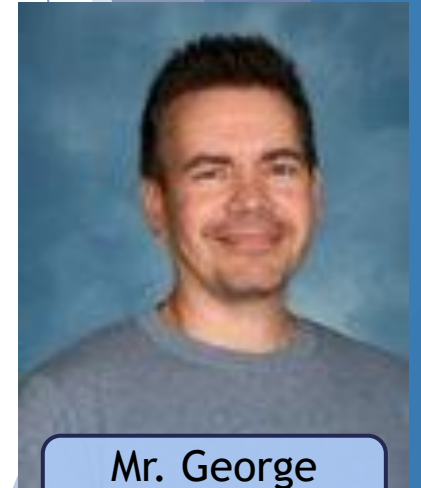

# IB: CAS Requirement— Creativity, Action, Service

- **Creativity** – continuous creative activity
- **Action**– continuous vigorous physical activity in Grade 11 and 12
- **Service**- participation in school service/community service/global service
- **Career and Life** – career/life component will be addressed through CAS

# University Admission Requirements



There are **TWO** types of admission requirements

## 1. **General post-secondary admission requirements**

**Ex. UBC, SFU, UVIC – Min. average required fluctuates year to year**

- English Studies 12
- 5 additional **academic** Grade 12 subjects  
(please check individual university websites)
  - Not Psychology 12, only IB Psychology counts as academic
- A language at the Grade 11 level (Challenge Exams)

**Ex. Kwantlen and UFV**

- English Studies 12
- 2 Grade 12 academics (min. B)



## 2) Specific Program Admission Requirements

### **Example: UBC and SFU Faculty of Science**

(min. admission average will fluctuate year to year)



- English Studies 12
- Physics 11 and Chemistry 11
- 2 Grade 12 Sciences (Chemistry, Physics, Biology)
- Pre-Calculus Math 12
- Total of 6 Grade 12 Academics (minimum)
- Language 11

# How do you apply to university?

**Education Planner**—used for many BC universities including UBC, SFU, UFV, UVic and KPU

- Post-Secondary Workshop with all Grade 12 students on Oct. 11 during Flex
- UBC specific workshop for Personal Profile on October 3 in the Gallery

**OUAC**—application portal that is used to apply to Ontario universities

- Workshop on OUAC on October 12 in the Learning Commons

**Common App**—application portal that is used to apply to US universities

- Workshop on Common App on October 10 in the Learning Commons

**CUE**--Canadian Universities Event for students on October 5 at the Langley Events Centre



# Applying to US Universities

- Common Applications website
- American universities have an earlier application deadline
  - Students encouraged to do the research for US schools find out when application deadlines are
- Let counsellors know if you need help with the application process

# Student PEN numbers & IB PIN

- Nine-digit number
- Assigned by BC Ministry of Education
- Located on report cards (top right-hand side)

- Applying for online courses

# University Application Process

## Deadlines

- UBC – January 15, 2024 (December 1, 2023 for scholarship consideration)
- SFU – January 31, 2024 (December 15, 2023 for scholarship consideration)
- UVic – January 31, 2024
- TWU – February 15, 2024
- Trade Schools – limited spaces; first qualified first accepted
- KPU, UFV - Ongoing until spaces are filled (June 1st) except specialty programs

**Please confirm with the post-secondary institution of your choice**

## When can students apply?

- UVic, TWU, Emily Carr – open now
- UFV, KPU – Oct 1
- BCIT – Oct 3
- UBC, SFU – Early October

# Self-Reporting Grades

---

- Post-secondary institutions send confirmation of application by email
- Applicant is given a student number for that school
- Use this for all communication with that institutions
- IB Diploma students use their Predicted Grades only for some Universities

## Self-Reporting Grades

- Most post-secondary schools use this method
- **Due dates are firm**
- What happens to courses that are in progress?
  - Online courses need to be completed by June

1. **Scholarship Handbook**—This is a great resource that highlights the types of scholarships available and how to apply for them. Please ensure that you read through this.

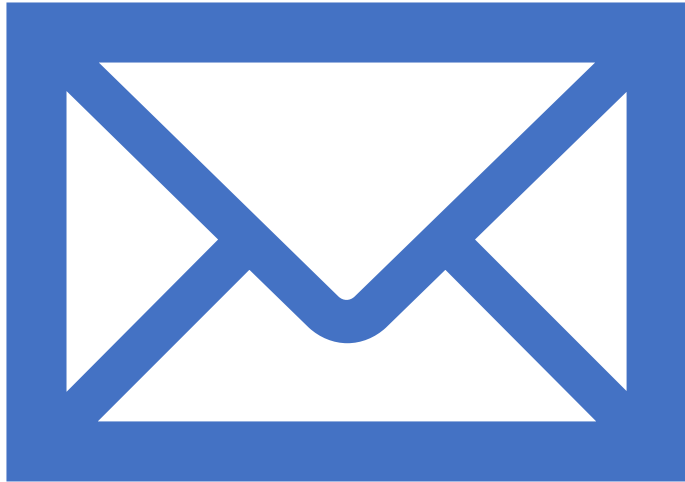
2. **Scholarship Database**—this is a database that collates different scholarships available to students. It can be found on the school district website.

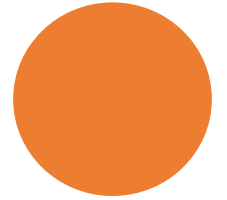
